The School: A Preschool – grade 12, board-owned school, in partnership with parents and churches, educational, evangelical, and interdenominational: selective admissions.

Mission: LCCS graduates followers of Jesus Christ who are skilled in Biblical scholarship and its integration into academics, the arts, athletics, and community; who are prepared for their vocation and higher education; and who reflect his image in life.

The Community: Lancaster County Christian School has two campuses in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The Leola Campus is located near Leola and the West Lampeter Campus is located near Bridgeport. The Leola campus has an elementary school and the high school. The West Lampeter campus has an elementary school and the middle school. Each campus has a gymnasium, media center, auditorium, cafeteria, science laboratories, computer laboratories, music rooms, art rooms, and athletic fields.

The Faculty: The faculty is composed of carefully selected, dedicated, born-again Christians from evangelical Christian backgrounds. All teachers whole-heartedly endorse the school's Statement of Faith. Nearly all faculty, grades K – 12, hold bachelors degrees. Thirty-six percent of the faculty holds advanced degrees.

Athletic Activities: *High School:* Fall – Boys Soccer and Girls Field Hockey; Winter – Boys and Girls Basketball; Spring – Boys Baseball and Girls Soccer. LCCS student-athletes have the opportunity to participate in athletics not offered at LCCS through an athletic cooperative agreement with JP McCaskey. Athletics offered through this agreement are: Tennis, Volleyball, Track & Field, Cross Country, Football, Wrestling, Bowling, Swimming, and Softball.

Middle School: Band, Choir, Orchestra, Worship team, Drama, Yearbook, general music instruction, Hand bells, Guitar, general art instruction, Art electives
Elementary School: Choir, grades 3-5; Band, grades 4-5; Worship Team, grades 3-5; strings instruction, grades 4-5; general art instruction, general music instruction

Busing: Public busing is offered through the following districts: Conestoga Valley, Eastern Lancaster County, Ephrata (Leola Campus only), Hempfield, Lampeter- Strasburg, Lancaster City, Manheim Central, Manheim Township, Penn Manor, Pequea Valley, Warwick, Solanco (West Lampeter Campus only).

A shuttle runs between the two campuses so parents only have to drop off and pick up at one location.
