Navigating the Artistic Success of Your Child

10:30 am – 12:00 noon

This will be a workshop for parents and will give an in-depth study into why every child should study music and how to make music a successful and meaningful part of your child's life. The Annie Moses Band will cover topics from choosing an instrument to finding a teacher, how to practice with your child, and creating an artistic community to enliven and encourage your child's musical growth. Most importantly, the study will highlight the way in which music enhances your child's fluency, giving them a strong voice with which to proclaim the truth and beauty of our Maker.

String Workshop

9:00 – 10:15 am

This will be a workshop for students and will be an exploration into the science behind the violin positions that are fundamental to the success of a violinist and are taught at major conservatories around the world. The Annie Moses Band will cover all the basics of right and left hand forms, as well as answer audience questions on more advanced techniques such as vibrato and bow strokes.

Take Charge of Education with Target REDcard

When supporters of Lancaster County Christian School enroll and use their REDcard, Target donates up to 1% of every purchase made with their REDcard to our school. The

funds add up as the number of people participating in the program increases. Parents, teachers, and other school supporters can designate LCCS online by visiting Target.com/tcoe or by calling 1-800-316-6142. Just use the Target REDcard whenever shopping at Target.

To get the REDcard credit account (Target Visa Credit Card or Target Credit Card), apply in stores or online at Target.com/apply.

Target also offers their newest product, the Target Check Card, which acts like a debit card by connecting to an existing checking account. School supporters can apply for the Target Check Card in stores.

Below is a summary of the rebates to date:

LCCS – West Lampeter Campus (School ID# 15445):

Wouldn't it be great if the two LCCS campuses could double the number of REDcard holders by the Thanksgiving/Christmas time period? Attendance

Throughout the school year we will feature policies from the Parent Student Handbook as helpful reminders. The following is from the Attendance section:

Our goal is to have students attend every class every day. School hours are from 8:10 am to 2:45 pm daily. We know that illness or family circumstances often make this impossible; however, we want to encourage students to treat school attendance as a serious matter and that daily use of their intellectual gifts is an act of worship. The State Department of Education and the Administration of Lancaster County Christian School establish attendance rules. Students absent from school for any reason are responsible for meeting all class requirements. Parents must call the school by 8:30 am if their son or daughter will be absent. The school will call the home of any student who is absent and for whom no call has been received. This does not replace the need for an excuse card. If an absence is for more than a common illness, a

doctor's excuse may be necessary. After three (3) or more days of absence, a doctor's excuse is required for re-entry into school.
