### **Calendar Reminder**

This is a reminder that all upcoming events can be found on ParentsWeb under the calendar tab. This calendar includes school events, field trips, holidays, early dismissals, etc.

### **Upcoming Early Dismissals**

Please note some upcoming early dismissals. Please arrange to pick up your children these days as public busing does not run on early dismissal days.

*Friday, November 12*, noon dismissal for all students on both campuses; parent-teacher conferences from 1:00 – 5:00 pm

*Wednesday, November 24*, noon dismissal for all students on both campuses (Thanksgiving vacation)

*Wednesday, December 22*, 11:00 am dismissal for all students on both campuses (Christmas vacation)

*Wednesday and Thursday, January 12 and 13*, noon dismissal for high school students only (midterm exams)

*Friday, January 14*, noon dismissal for all students on both campuses (end of quarter 2)

### **Inclement Weather School Closings FAQs**

In the event of LCCS closing because of severe weather and dangerous road conditions or some other emergency, you will be able to obtain information in the following ways:

1. Tune in to TV channels WGAL 8 or Fox 43.
2. Tune in to radio stations WROZ 101.3 FM, WJTL 90.3 FM, WDAC 94.5 FM, WARM 103 FM, or WSBA 910 AM.
3. Check the school closing/delay page on WGAL TV 8.
4. Sign up for email alerts from WGAL TV 8.
5. Check the LCCS website's home page (www.lccs.cc).

### ***What happens when school closes early?***

During the school day, early closing will be announced on the radio/TV stations listed above and posted on our website. If your district closes early, LCCS will send your students home on their bus at the time it arrives at LCCS. Parents may use their own discretion in picking up their children at the school in this situation. Student drivers may

leave at the time that their home district dismisses for the day. Parents can find out when their child is leaving LCCS by following their district's closing time.

***What if school dismissal is near the lunch hour?***

If early dismissal occurs during or near the lunch period, it is usually possible to allow students to eat prior to dismissal.

***Will after school activities be held if school is dismissed early?***

If early dismissal occurs during the day, extra-curricular and evening activities are usually canceled. Please check the school's website.

Local districts call our receptionists to inform them of bus arrival times when districts are closing. Since we have a limited number of phone lines, please refrain from calling the school. Please check the school's website.

Presto-Pay is a convenient way for your family to pay LCCS online at the time you place your Scrip order. Great Lakes Scrip Company will electronically accept your payment on behalf of LCCS.

Great Lakes will automatically debit your checking account for the face value amount of your order, plus a small convenience fee of \$0.39, and hold that payment until your non-profit's order has been released by your coordinator.

## **High School Class Trip Update**

This is a message from Spiritual Formation Coordinator, Jim Schwenck, in regards to high school class trips.

Jesus' final words to His followers before leaving earth were recorded by Luke in Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." I used to believe that Jesus intended this as sort of a progressive Gospel. We go to Jerusalem, and finish the spread of the Gospel there first. Then we move on to Judea, and so on. But there is not even a hint of this in Jesus' words! We are supposed to be sharing the Holy Spirit-empowered Gospel locally, regionally, nationally and internationally . . . all at the same time.

This is the motivation behind our high school service and mission trips. Our freshmen will be serving locally in the city of Lancaster immersing themselves in life and service at the Water Street Rescue Mission and Teen Haven (Nov. 16-18). The sophomore class will travel to the cradle of American independence serving Christ through Urban Hope Ministries in Philadelphia (Nov. 17-19). Northeastern Pennsylvania's Pocono Mountains are the target area for our juniors, serving the people of that region through various non-profit organizations (Nov. 16-18). Our seniors will board a plane in New Jersey and land in Lima, Peru to begin an 8-day international, cross-cultural ministry opportunity (Nov. 12-20).

An amazing amount of prayer and planning have gone into these trips, and we have endeavored to keep the cost as reasonable as possible. Feel free to direct questions to your child's class advisors or to Dr. Jim Schwenk, Spiritual Formation Coordinator.

### **Field Trip to Zook Molasses and Good Food, Inc.**

The following article was written by a fifth grade LCCS student about his field trip experience.

On Tuesday, October 5, we went on a field trip to Zook Molasses and Good Food. When we first got there, we looked at some pictures of the tornado and the destruction that hit their company in November of 1999. Mrs. Mellette's brother-in-law, Ron Glessner, told us about the tornado and showed us where all the molasses is stored.

After that, he showed us upstairs where all the food is packaged. He showed us a new assembly line that makes caramel but it wasn't running that day. He showed us some other assembly lines, too. One man had something like a suction cup that could pick up a package and put it with the other packages on a skid.

They use the assembly line because they make more products with less people so they don't have to pay as many salaries. After showing us around, we tried molasses and blackstrap molasses. We also tried sorghum, then we had lunch. Lunch was pizza, Auntie Anne's soft pretzels, apples with the caramel they make there, and Herr's potato chips. For drinks, we could have either Sprite, water, or my favorite - Root Beer. Some kids got some snacks and drinks from the vending machine. After we ate lunch, we went to the shop and got candy, pancake mix, and lots of other stuff. Mrs. Mellette's parents and sisters then provided a goodie bag for all of us. The goodie bag was filled with candy, a flashlight, a molasses cookie, a pad of paper and a pencil.

When we got back from our field trip, we had to fill out a paper about Zook Molasses and Good Food. Zook Molasses started in 1934. Good Food, Inc started in 1980. Zook Molasses makes products for animals and Good Food products for people. Zook Molasses and Good Food makes products for many different companies. They get oil that has been squeezed out of soybeans. They take the oil and then they mix it and make it into olive oil and other oils that you eat. You can't make it into car oil but it still is useful.
