Our LCCS Christmas Concerts are quickly approaching! 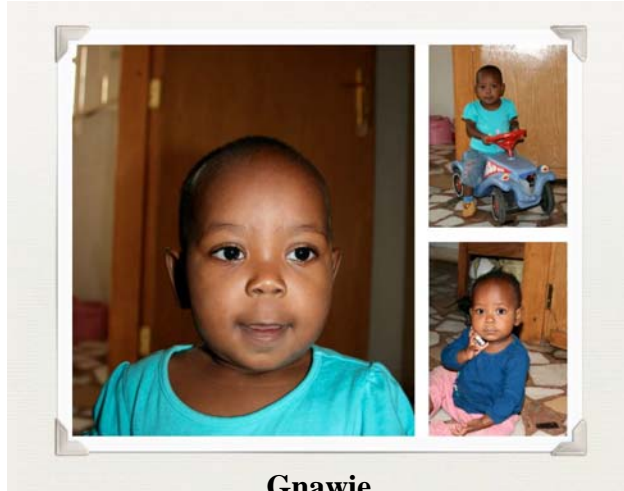
Leola campus (Dec. 2): On the night of the concert, PreK-2nd grade students should report to their classrooms at 6:45 pm, Grades 3-5 should report to their classrooms at 6:30 pm, and high school students should report to the Lower Level at 6:30 pm. Elementary students will return to their classrooms to be picked up after the concert.

West Lampeter campus (Dec. 9): On the night of the concert, PreK-2nd grade students should report to their designated area of the Student Life Center at 6:45 pm, Grades 3-5 should report to their area at 6:30 pm, and middle school students should report to the SLC Music Room at 6:30 pm.

Remember elementary students will not have school the day after their concert due to the late evening of the event. Leola elementary students will not have school on Friday, December 3 and West Lampeter elementary students will not have school on Friday, December 10.

## **Scrip Program**

Some of you might have basic questions about the Scrip fundraising program. Information is available to you through the LCCS website. Once you have entered our website, go to the “Current Families” tab and scroll to “Scrip”. Another idea for the holidays is to print a copy of the vendors (found under the “Shop” menu tab at the bottom right hand corner of the page) and encourage your co-workers to place orders which would then be processed through your account. Remember that Scrip orders will not be processed the weeks of **November 22, November 29, December 20 and December 27**. Please make note of these dates and plan your shopping accordingly!
