Scrip Program

What Is Scrip?

Scrip is a term that means “substitute money”. When you purchase scrip, you’re purchasing prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, you earn money for our school.

How scrip generates money for LCCS

The Great Lakes Scrip Center acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of scrip from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the scrip is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount, from two to fifteen percent or more. LCCS buys the scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount, and re-sells the certificates for full face value. LCCS profits as a result of the discount that retailers give to the school for each purchase. Earnings will be split 50% to Lancaster County Christian School and 50% to individual tuition accounts.

Scrip is "shopping cart fundraising"

Scrip is a quick and simple fundraiser because families don’t have to sell anything. By using Scrip to purchase things you normally buy, our school makes money. Groceries, clothing, toys, gifts, even gasoline can be purchased with Scrip.

How to Begin

Getting started only takes a minute or two. Here are easy step-by-step directions:

1. First you must create an account at ShopWithScrip.com and identify yourself as a member of our organization.
 - A. Go to www.shopwithscrip.com. Enter the orange Member’s Login box on the right side and click “Not a member? Click Here”

- i. Follow the simple registration instructions and accept the terms and conditions of using the site.
 - B. The next screen you will see is called “join an organization”.
 - i. Insert LCCS’s enrollment code (3A6FA71C14942)
 - C. From this site, you can check your account activity, change your profile and password and read coordinator and site announcements.
- 2. Ordering Scrip
 - A. Click “Order Scrip” at the top of any page.
 - B. Go shopping at the hundreds of retailers included in the program.
 - i. Select items and quantities and press “add to cart”.
 - ii. Print the “order confirmation page”.
- 3. The following items, which are available at the Welcome Center at the West Lampeter Campus and the school lobby at the Leola Campus, need to be included to submit your order by 8:30 on Monday morning
 - A. Order confirmation page
 - B. Check for the amount ordered, made payable to Lancaster County Christian School
 - C. Scrip Enrollment Form and Waiver (with first order only)
 - i. Indicate on your Enrollment Form as to whether your child is permitted to bring your order home or if you would like to personally pick them up.

PSAT news

High School is a time of making many choices. One of those choices is what kind of tests students want to take in order to achieve admission to various schools of higher education. One test is the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT). The PSAT/NMSQT measures verbal reasoning, critical thinking, math problem-solving and writing skills students have developed over many years both in and out of school. By taking this test as a junior, students will also be entering the Merit Program which could lead to scholarships for college undergraduate study. Juniors who are thinking about education after high school should take it. Sophomores will want to take it as practice. The PSAT will be given at Lancaster County Christian School on Wednesday, October 13 at 8:20 am. Please sign up in the Business office with Mrs. Godshall or Mrs. Workman along with the \$16.00 registration fee by check or cash. Please make checks payable to LCCS. Please sign up by Monday, September 27. When signing up students will receive a PSAT news bulletin and a practice test. Begin praying now for God's direction for you after high school!
