COVID PROCEDURES



- Desks are distanced from one another and cleaned each time students leave the room
- Handwashing is done before and after going to a special

LOG FOLDERS

Your child has three log folders:

- **Math facts:** Every satellite day, students will be asked to practice math facts. Please place a check mark on the calendar days that your child practices their math facts. I will ask for these logs back at the **end of every month.**
- **Reading:** Please list the books that your child reads every quarter. In quarter 1, students are asked to read 5 books, and one should be related to something in social studies. However, the book does not need to be something specific to what we are learning in social studies. **I will ask for this log to be returned at the end of each quarter.**
- **Bible memorization:** Each week, your child will have a memory verse to memorize. We go over it each day in class, and it should be practiced during each satellite day. There is a powerpoint on Google classroom that will be updated with the weekly verse. You may memorize it in any translation that you would prefer. **I will ask for this log to be returned at the end of each quarter.**

GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Each week, I will post my lesson plans under “Lesson Plans for the Week”

- My lesson plans for “in class” days will be here
- Satellite lesson plans will be here

Resources needed for satellite days will be under the specific day. For example, if your student need to read a web article, I will post the link under “September 9th”

Email

CLASSROOM BEHAVIOR

If I need to contact you about your child's behavior, I will email you about it so you are aware. I will also talk to your child privately should their behavior should an issue arise.

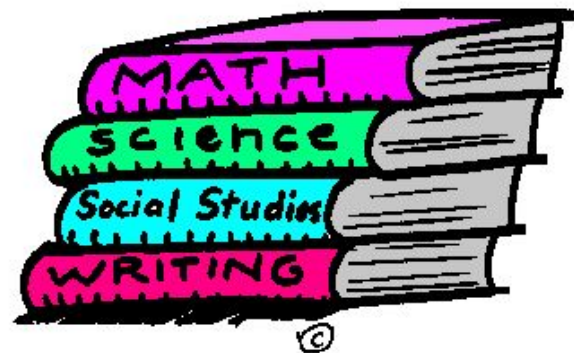


CLASSROOM RULES

We as a class have come up with our own set of rules that we call “camp rules.” They are written on our door, and each student signed at the bottom to confirm that they will abide by these rules throughout the year.

HOMework

Should I need to assign homework throughout the year, it will only be on Monday nights. The maximum amount of time that homework will be/take is 30 minutes. It is not my desire to assign homework unless absolutely necessary, and there will not be any for this first quarter.



JOURNALS

You child has three journals

Writing: This is where we will work on writing pieces, revising writing, and completing writing prompts.

Bible: This is where we will apply what we have learned about Biblical concepts by answering questions, answering prompts, etc.

Math: This is where we will write down mathematical concepts and definitions.

You have already seen these journals at home for satellite days. They will come back and forth frequently.

"HOMEWORK FOLDERS"

Your child has been given a folder labeled "homework" by me. This does not mean that what comes home in this folder is homework. Rather, it is a take home folder that includes handouts, worksheets, etc. that will need to be completed on satellite days :)

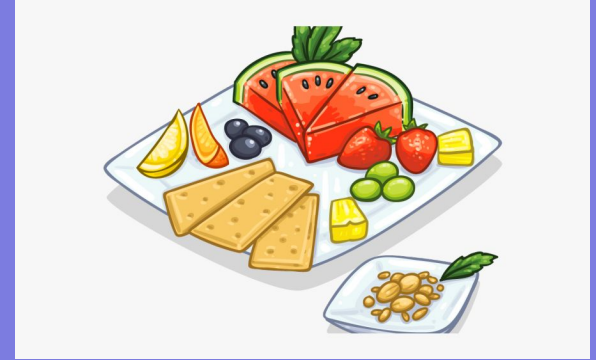

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Send your child to school dressed appropriately for the weather. We go outside unless it is raining or below 20 degrees.
- Send a snack with your child. Keep in mind that we might be working through snack at times, so snack should not be messy.
- Send in a water bottle for your child each day to keep at their seat.
- Provide a structured routine on satellite days at home. Provide your child with an area where they are able to get work done efficiently.
- Respond to emails if response is needed.
- Understand that teachers make mistakes too. If you see a wrong page number or a mistake on a lesson plan, please send me an email so I can let the rest of the parents know.
- Help create a positive parent environment/community.

SNACKS

Students are permitted to **bring water bottles** with lids to keep in the classroom. Students will take them home each evening. Please fill with water only – no juice, soda, etc. We will have a snack break each morning around 9:30, and one in the afternoon around 1:30. Please send a healthy snack to keep your child's brain awake and at its best! Snacks can include fruit, cheese, pretzels, granola bars, etc. Please, no messy or sugary snacks.



BIRTHDAYS!

- Students may bring in a birthday treats on or near their birthday to share with the class. If your child has a summer birthday, we will celebrate them in the spring.
- Each product must be store-bought and wrapped individually.
- Please contact me a week ahead of time if you are planning to bring a treat.
- Parents may not bring snacks to the lunchroom or classroom.

DISMISSAL
